Is 2013 audi a7 reliable

The 2013 Audi A7 and S7 are part of the "4-door coupe" concept, which combines the sleekness of a coupe with the practicality of a sedan. The A7 features an alluring roofline and incorporates a rear hatch over a generous cargo deck. It embodies the best of Audi's offerings: emotive design, advanced technology, compelling driving dynamics, and practical functionality. The S7 is distinguished by subtle badging, trim, and 1-inch-larger wheels. MMI Touch, available on Premium Plus trims, allows drivers to input letters and numbers with a fingertip. It turns out to be less gimmicky and more practical than expected. The 2013 Audi A7's navigation system features Google Earth, providing an impressive and practical experience. With its helicopter-like map view, navigation becomes a delight, offering improved awareness of the surrounding area. The standard equipment list includes leather seats, heated front seats, and a power sunroof. The Premium Plus trim adds Navigation with Google Earth, MMI touch, and an 8-inch screen, while the Prestige trim offers keyless entry, a Bose audio system, and ventilated front seats. Standard safety features include stability control, traction control, and six airbags. The A7's 3.0 supercharged V6 engine produces 310 horsepower, allowing for zero-to-60-mph acceleration in just 5.4 seconds. The S7 model boasts a 420-horsepower twin-turbo V8, achieving zero-to-60-mph in 4.5 seconds. Both models feature quattro AWD, improving stability and confidence on slippery roads. In terms of reliability, the Audi A7 has been reported to be one of the most reliable used luxury cars, with a 90.1% rating in a 2023 used car reliability survey. However, some owners have reported issues with non-engine electrics, a mildly noisy centre diff, and rattles from the trim surrounding the gear lever.
