In most cases you should use a singular pronoun if your sentence has a singular subject. Sometimes, however, you do not know the preferred gender of the subject of your sentence or the subject identifies as neither male nor female. In those cases you might rework the sentence to eliminate the need for a singular pronoun or, if that is not possible or results in awkward or unclear writing, you can use they, them or their as a singular, gender-neutral pronoun.In the past, writers used "his" as a generic pronoun to include both male and female. In this example, 'John' is a singular male, so the singular male possessive pronoun 'his' is used. Rule 2: Subjective pronouns and verbs Subjective pronouns perform actions, hence are always followed by a verb. Example: They run a profitable business.
