The academy has seen significant improvement, jumping 332 spots in the statewide ranking and outperforming over 65% of districts in Ohio. Our comprehensive school directory provides essential data for parents, students, and educators to make informed decisions. Within our community, there are approximately 246 students, with a teacher-to-student ratio of 11.18. The student body consists of 131 males (53.25%) and 115 females (46.75%). Students can be categorized into several racial groups, including American Indian/Alaska Native (0%), Asian or Asian Pacific Islander (0.41%), Hispanic (9.35%), Black or African American (68.29%), White (8.13%), Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islanders (0%), and Two or More Races (13.82%). Toledo Preparatory And Fitness Academy offers various extracurricular activities, including sports teams and academic clubs, to enrich students' learning experiences. The school also provides academic programs such as Advanced Placement courses, honors programs, and specialized tracks catering to diverse interests and career aspirations. Support services are available to students, including counseling, special education programs, and enrichment initiatives designed to meet individual needs. The school actively engages with parents, local organizations, and the broader community through events, volunteer opportunities, and partnerships aimed at enhancing the educational experience. Ohio's public schools offer a well-rounded education that lets students explore their interests through diverse electives and core subjects. High schools in the state cover grades nine to twelve, providing opportunities for academic growth, extracurricular activities, and preparation for higher studies or careers. Several key factors contribute to Ohio's public school system's success: rigorous curriculum standards set by the state ensure that students meet specific learning goals at each grade level; regular assessments like the Ohio State Tests evaluate student progress in subjects such as English, math, science, and social studies; teachers must obtain valid licenses from the Ohio Department of Education after meeting required education and testing criteria; and funding comes from a mix of state, local, and federal sources. However, despite its strengths, Ohio's public school system faces challenges like unequal funding between affluent and low-income districts, achievement gaps among student subgroups based on race, socioeconomic status, or disability, and issues of educational equity due to disparities in resources and access to advanced coursework. Initiatives have been implemented to address these issues, including reforms to the school funding formula to reduce inequalities, investments in early childhood education to mitigate achievement gaps, professional development for teachers to enhance instructional quality, and community engagement to support student success. Toledo Performance Academy aims to create an inclusive and supportive environment that caters to the diverse needs of its students. By addressing challenges such as funding disparities, achievement gaps, and educational equity, Ohio can foster a more equitable future for its students and communities. Our academy offers a well-rounded curriculum (K-8) that encompasses subjects like math, reading, writing, science, citizenship, and various sports. We strive to balance academics with physical fitness and personal development, enabling our students to become well-rounded individuals. Parents are encouraged to reach out to us with any questions or concerns via phone or online contact form. Our staff is dedicated to helping students achieve their goals and maintain transparent communication. Student-teacher ratio for Lucas County is 17:1. Nearby schools include Toledo Preparatory And Fitness Academy, as well as other elementary, middle, and high schools in the area. The academy provides free public education under a charter granted by the state legislature. It also offers an extended school day environment emphasizing math, reading, writing, science, and citizenship, along with tennis, martial arts, soccer, and sports psychology and physiology. The school aims to develop students' strong minds and bodies in grades kindergarten through eighth grade, serving approximately 270 students. We offer a variety of themed activities and gross motor skill exercises for our students. Our before and after school care program runs from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 a.m., Monday through Friday, and from 4:00 p.m. to 5:45 p.m., Monday through Thursday. We have five key principles that our students are expected to follow: academic excellence, fitness excellence, teamwork, moral and ethical behavior, and school spirit. Our families are also expected to adhere to certain "non-negotiables," including arriving on time for school, which begins at 8:00 a.m., dressing in full uniform, and following our ten simple Successful School-Wide Behaviors. These behaviors include being quiet, raising your hand, keeping hands and feet to yourself, remaining quiet during transitions, getting ready for class promptly, accepting feedback without talking back, and being kind. Students who exhibit these behaviors will be rewarded with Dragon Dollars. With the help of our staff and support from parents, we aim to make this a successful school year for our children, the leaders of tomorrow!
