I. Causative agents

Polio (also called poliomyelitis) is a highly contagious disease that is caused by a virus that attacks the nervous system. Children younger than five years old are more likely to get this virus than any other age group. The symptoms of polio are rarely seen. There are different kinds of polio and each one of them has different symptoms. Non-paralytic polio symptoms last only for about two days to a week and include: fever, sore throat, headache, vomiting, fatigue, problem swallowing/breathing, and spasms. The symptoms of paralytic polio include first the symptoms of non-paralytic polio and then loss of reflexes, severe muscle pain and spasms, spine weakness, sudden paralysis, and deformed limbs (mostly of ankles and feet). The symptoms of abortive polio include continuous muscle and joint weakness, muscle atrophy, sleep apnea, and becoming easily cold.
