
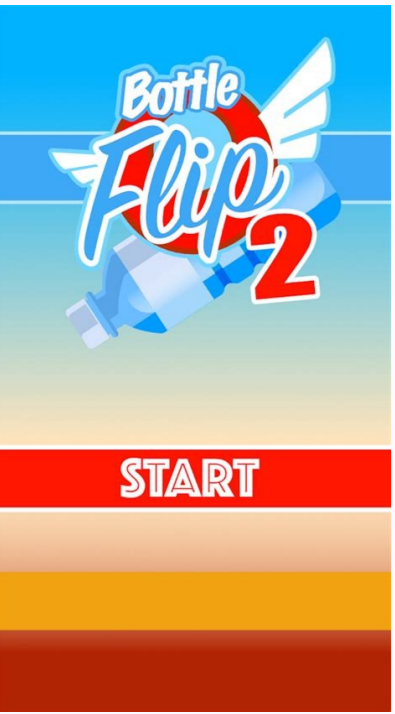

The Water Bottle Challenge involves playing a prank on a friend or family member by unexpectedly pouring water on them in time to a song.
